We can connect you with a dedicated Information and Support Worker who can provide you with access to...

Emotional support via regular check-ins by telephone call, video call, email or text so you can talk about your fears, concerns and challenges in a safe and confidential space.

Financial support including guidance on benefits, access to a small grant of up to £350 from Mummy's Star, referrals to other grant giving organisations and charities who can offer you practical support.

Online Forums offering you peer support by connecting you with other families who have experienced cancer around their pregnancy.
